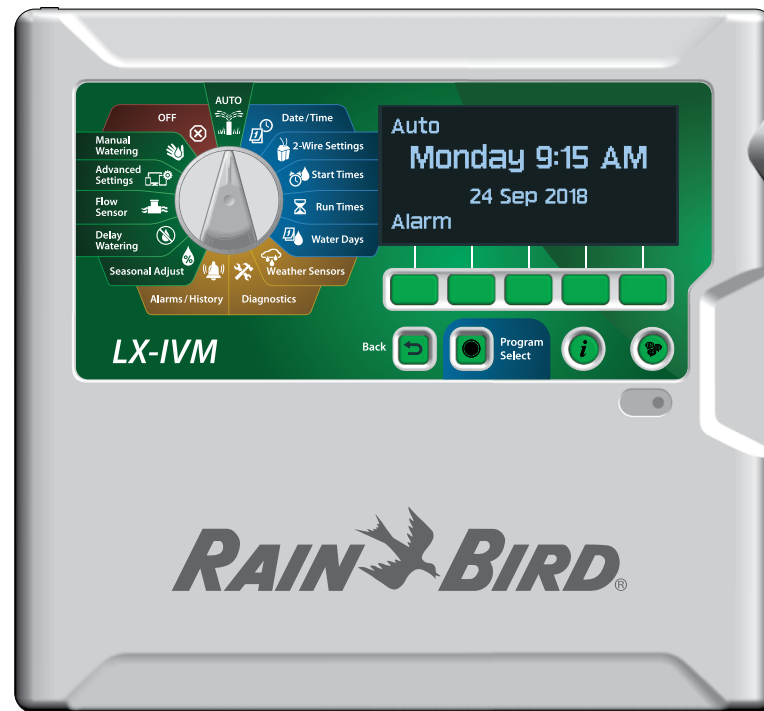

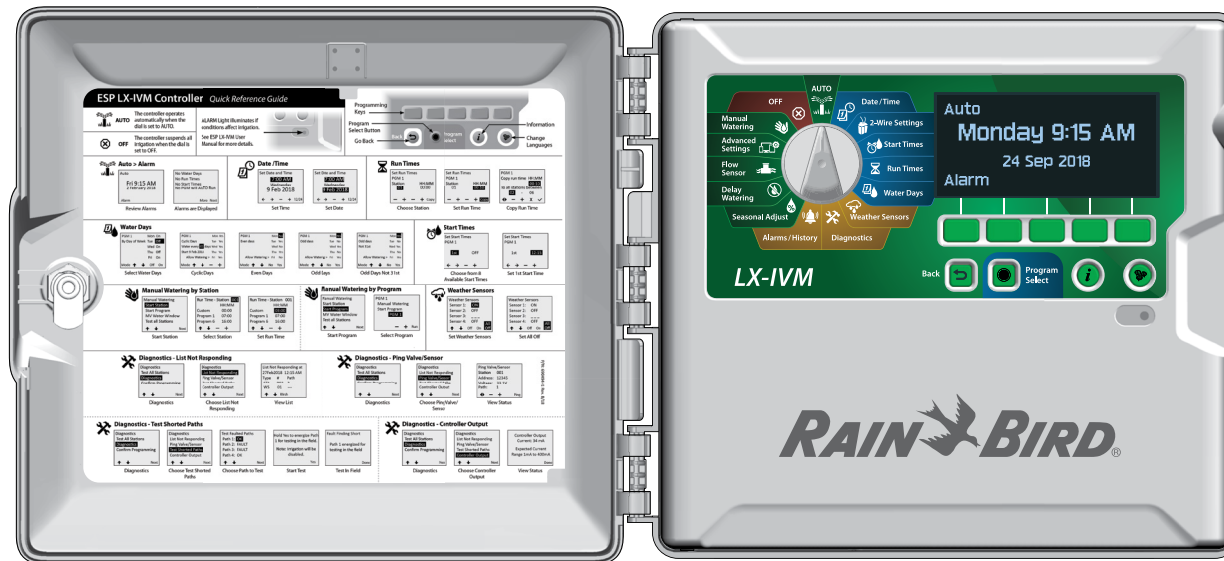

Controls, Switches and Indicators

Key operational features of the ESP-LXIVM Controller:

1 Programming Dial

Used to select irrigation features, programming and to turn the controller on and off.

2 Display

Shows time of day during normal operation; shows commands during programming; shows active station and remaining run time during watering

3 Programming Keys

Press keys to set and change program information.

4 Back Button

During programming, press the Back button to go back to the previous screen.

5 Program Select Button

Select the desired watering Program to set independent irrigation schedules.

6 Information Button

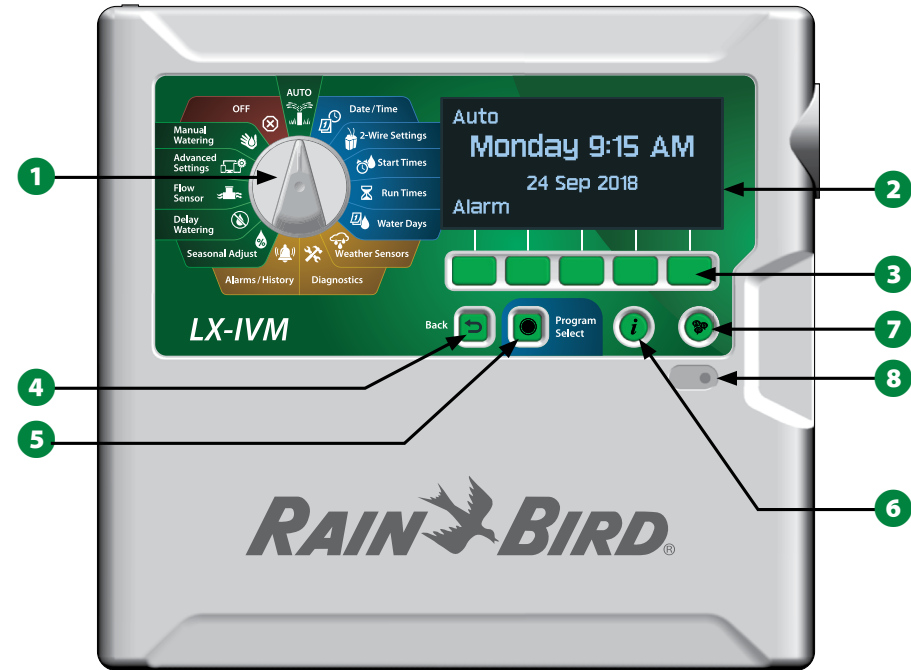
Press to see information about each feature on the dial and screen.

7 Language Button

Press to change the interface language. Choose from English, Spanish, French, German, Portuguese or Italian.

8 Alarm Light

Illuminates to indicate various types of alarm conditions.



ESP-LXIVM Controller Front Panel Features

2-Wire path Overview

2-Wire path Design

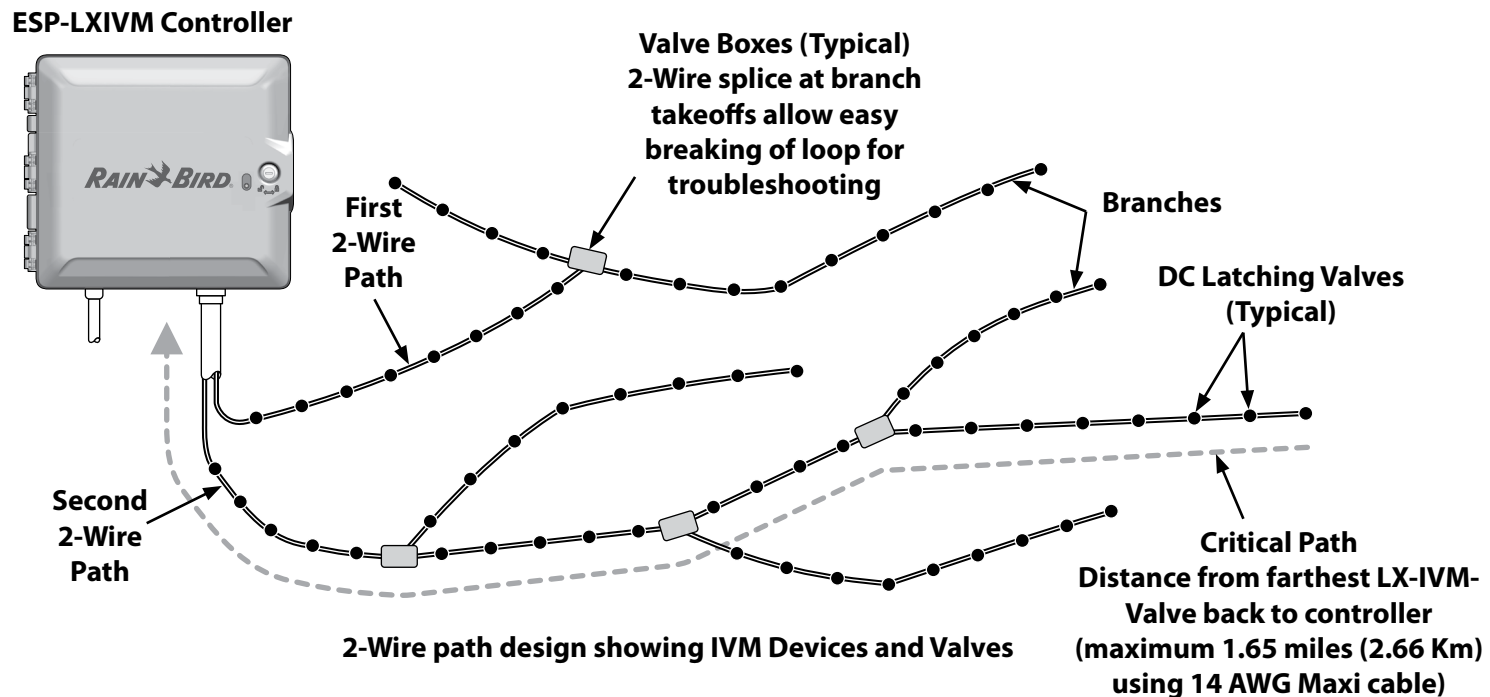
The ESP-LXIVM controller with 2-Wire path has key advantages over traditional controllers that use separate wires for each valve.

- The 2-Wire path design allows DC Latching Valves to be attached at any location, allowing greater design flexibility and greater distances to be supported.
- The LX-IVM controller has connections for up to four separate 2-Wire Paths.
- DC Latching Valves can be managed using up to 6.61 miles (10.63 Km) of wire path, if looped.

Star Pattern

A Star Pattern allows branching as often as necessary without ever looping the wire back to the controller.

This generally allows more design flexibility but at the expense of some distance. The distance from the controller to the farthest IVM Device is known as the critical path; the greatest distance supported with 14 AWG cable in a Star Pattern is 1.65 miles (2.66 Km).

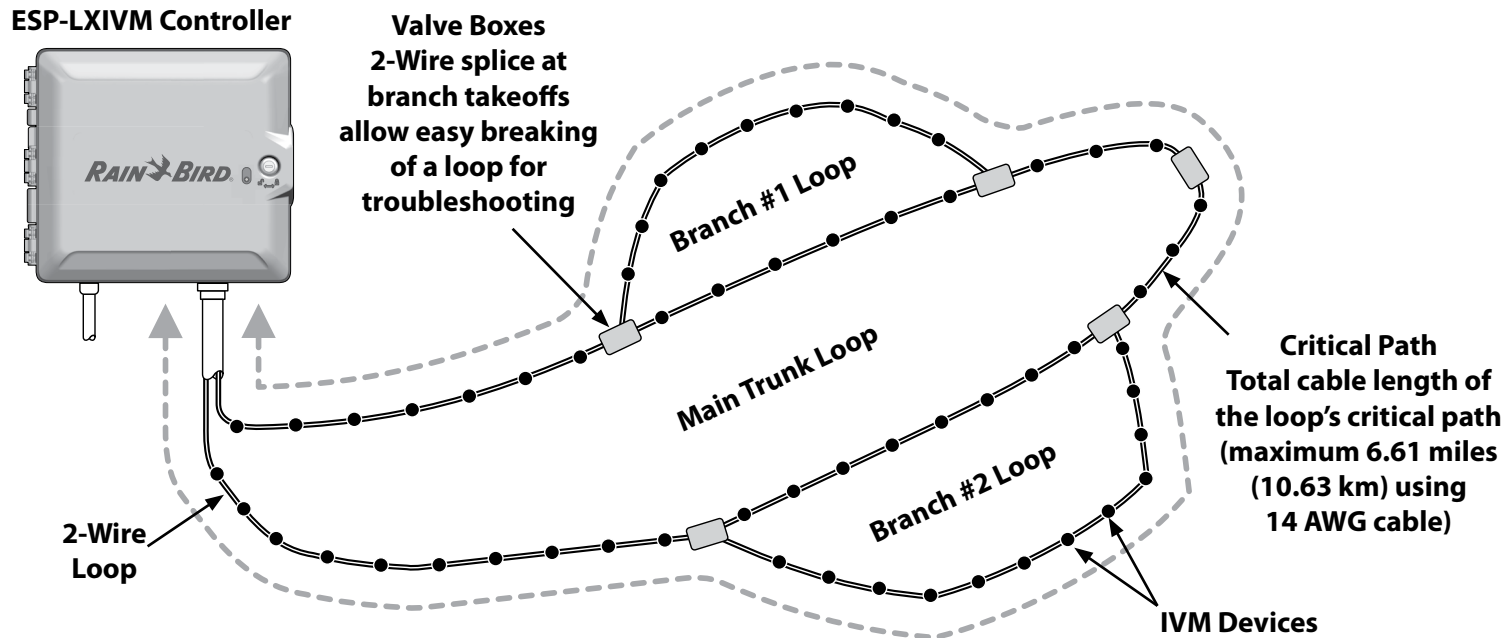


Loop Pattern

A Loop Pattern supports the greatest distance from controller to IVM Devices.

The Loop Pattern requires that the 2-Wire path loop back and return to the controller. The critical path for a Loop design is determined by calculating the distance around the loop to the farthest IVM Device and back to the controller. For both the Star and Loop designs, different distances can be supported with larger gauge cable.

2-Wire Devices

LX-IVM 2-Wire Devices attach directly to the 2-Wire path to control valves and/or monitor sensors (weather and flow).

Types of 2-Wire Devices

IVM-SOL Integrated Valve Modules

IVM-SOL is used to control compatible Rain Bird Valves such as PEB, PESB, PGA, BPES and EFB series. IVM-SOL can be used for both station and master valves. Compatible valves are also available with a factory installed IVM-SOL.

IVM-OUT (Output Device)

IVM-OUT 2-Wire control devices can be used to control valves with DC latching solenoids.

IVM-SEN (Sensor Device)

Flow and weather sensors are connected to the 2-Wire path via IVM-SEN 2-Wire devices.

IVM-SD (Surge Device)

The IVM-SD provides surge protection for the ESP-LXIVM controller and the 2-Wire path.

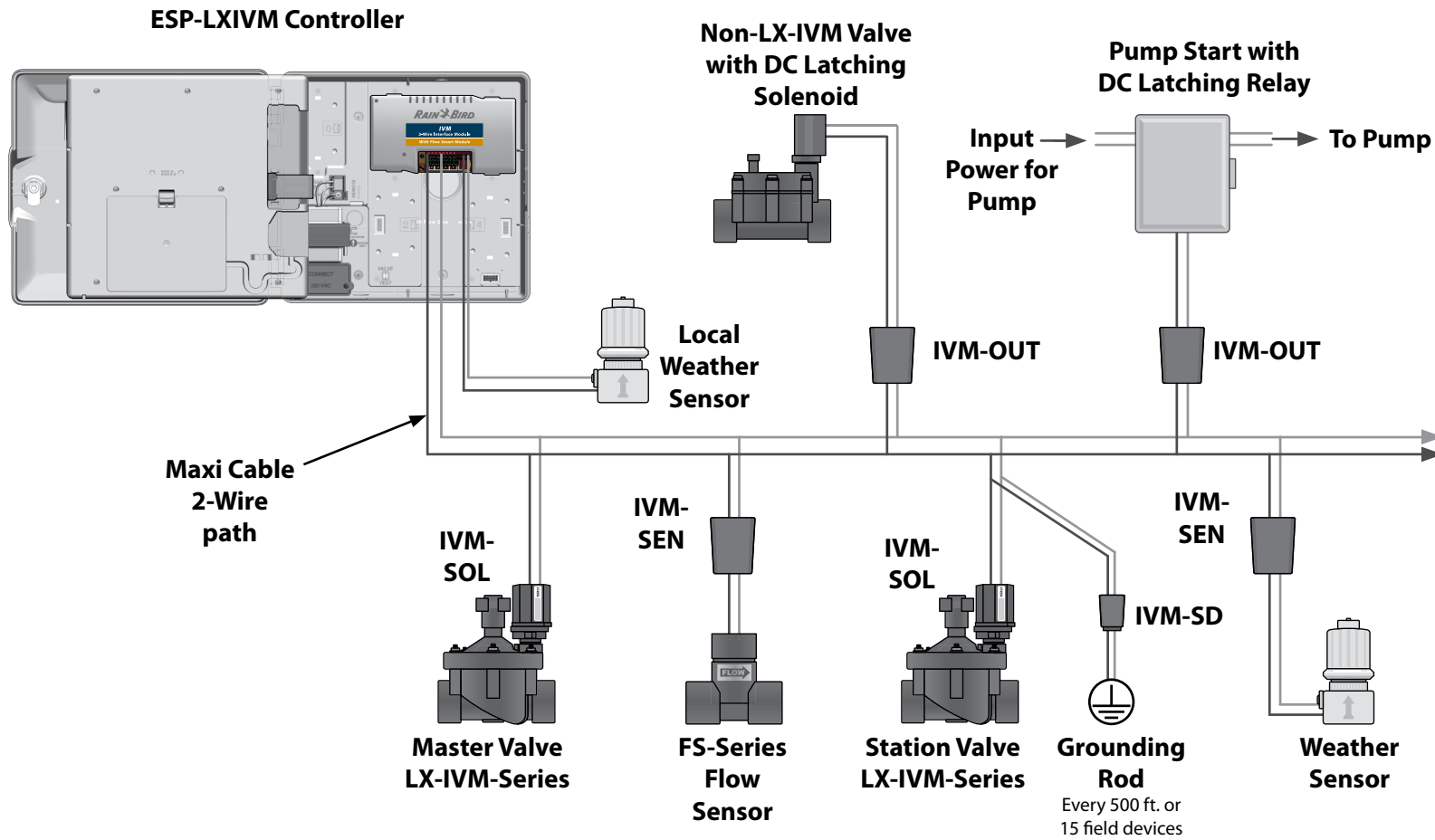
2-Wire Device Addresses

All LX-IVM 2-Wire Devices have a unique five digit address printed on the label of each device for identification on the 2-Wire path.

Local Weather Sensor

A local weather sensor such as a rain shutoff device can also connect directly to the IVM 2-Wire Interface Module inside the controller via a separate wired or wireless connection.

- Both the LX-IVM and LX-IVM Pro support one Local Weather Sensor.

Valves (Stations)

Valves, or stations are controlled and operate according to irrigation programs.

The controller is programmed to send signals to an LX-IVM-Valve, which opens and closes on a timed schedule. For example, the controller sends the first LX-IVM-Valve a signal to open, allowing irrigation. When that program is finished, the controller shuts off that valve and sends a signal for the second LX-IVM-Valve to open and so on.

Advanced Station Settings and Features

The ESP-LXIVM has many powerful Advanced station settings, including:

Cycle+Soak

Allows water to be applied to stations intermittently and is useful for locations such as hillsides which can be difficult to irrigate effectively. See "Cycle+Soak™" on page 33 for more details.

Inter Station Delay

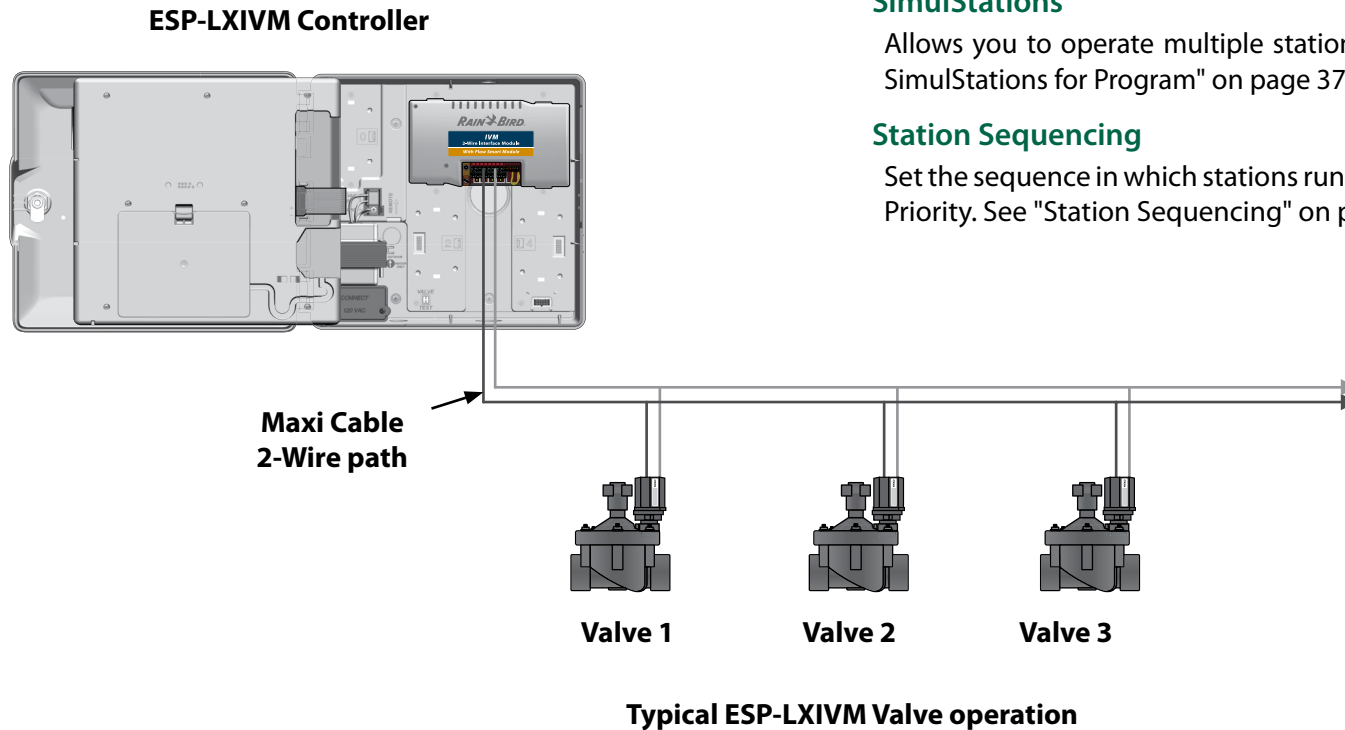
Delays the start of the next station in a program after the previous station completes. See "Inter-Station Delay" on page 36 for more details.

SimulStations

Allows you to operate multiple stations at the same time. See "Set SimulStations for Program" on page 37 for more details.

Station Sequencing

Set the sequence in which stations run by Station Number or Station Priority. See "Station Sequencing" on page 38 for more details.



Programming Overview

Programs

The controller opens and closes the ESP-LXIVM-Valves according to a program you set. Each program contains:

Watering Start Times

The time(s) of day when a station is programmed to begin watering; all other stations in the program then follow in sequence. See "Set Watering Start Times" on page 42 for more details.

Station Run Times

The length of time in hours and minutes that each individual station is programmed to run. "Set Station Run Times" on page 43 for more details.

Watering Days

The days of the week or calendar dates on which irrigation is allowed. See "Select Water Days" on page 45 for more details.

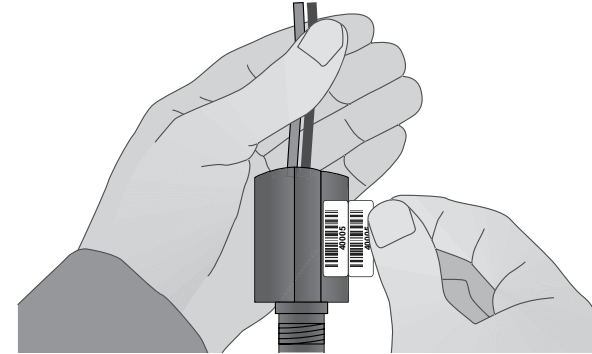

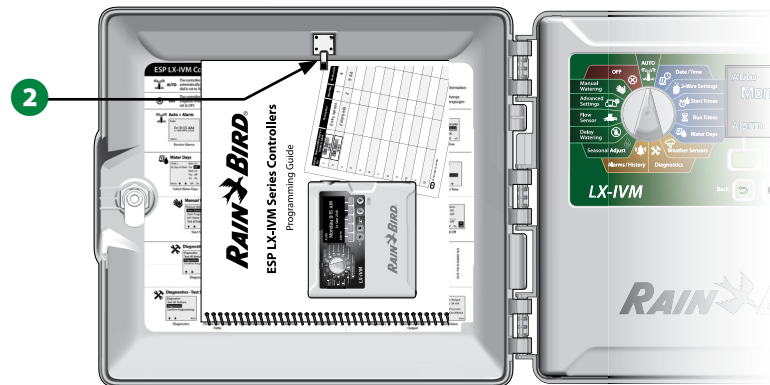

Remote Programming

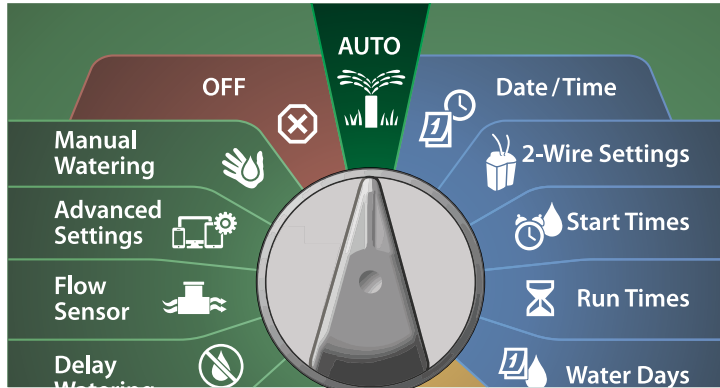
The ESP-LXIVM controller can be programmed while operating under battery power.

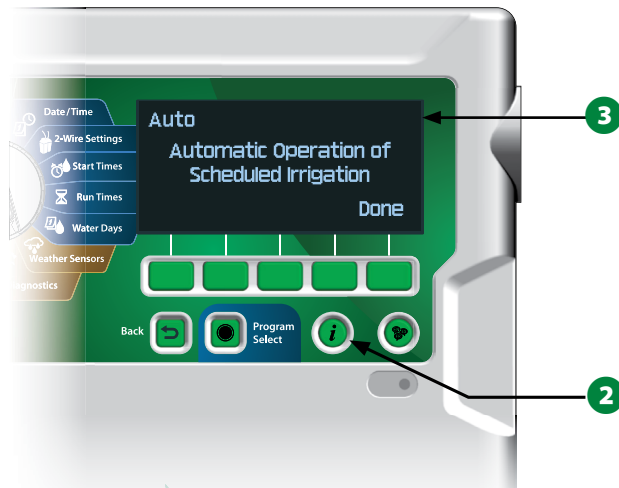
Information Button

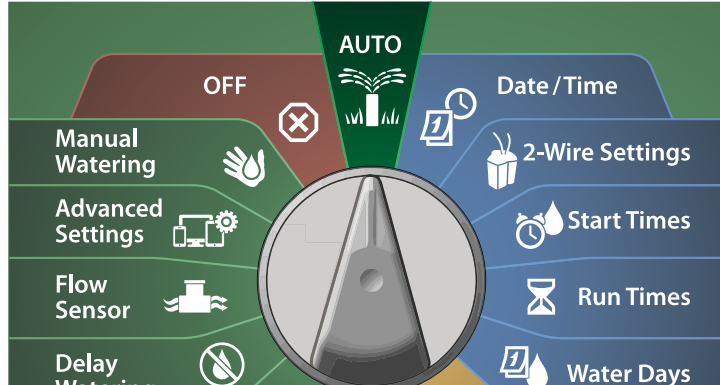

Automatic Operation

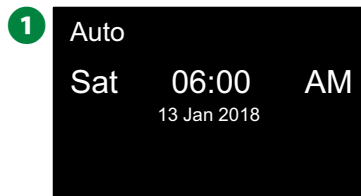
AUTO is the normal operating mode.



Turn the controller dial to AUTO



- 1 The Auto screen shows the current day and time.
- 2 When a program is running in AUTO mode, the station number will show on the screen. Press the + or – keys to add or subtract minutes from the run time for the currently running station. To advance to the next station in a program, press the Adv key.

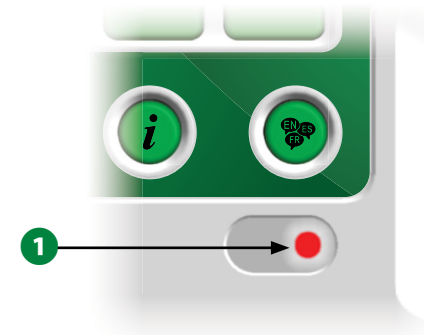


Alarms

An alarm condition can occur when programming omissions or other issues prevent normal irrigation.

Alarm Detected

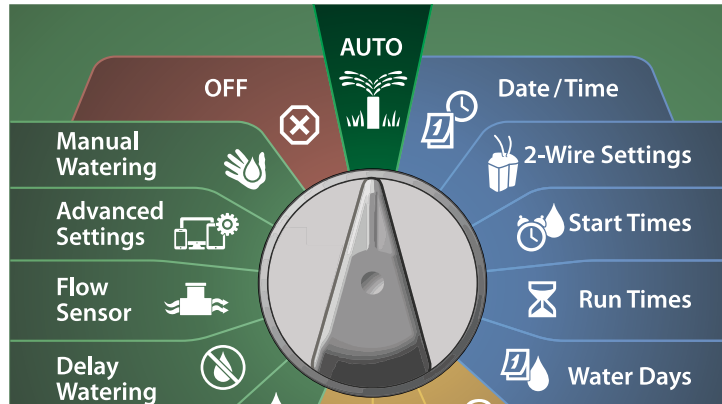
- 1 When an alarm condition is detected, the red alarm light on the controller front panel will illuminate.



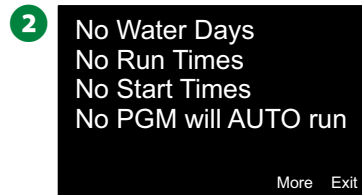
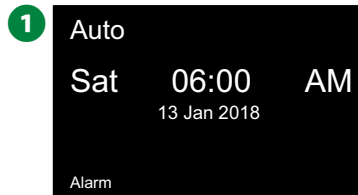
Alarm Conditions



Turn the controller dial to AUTO



- 1 When an alarm condition is present, the Alarm key label will be present on screen. Press the Alarm key to view alarm details.
- 2 Any present alarm conditions will then be shown. Press the More key to continue to the next page.



NOTE: Take the appropriate action to address each alarm condition. When all alarms have been addressed, the alarm light on the front panel will no longer be illuminated.

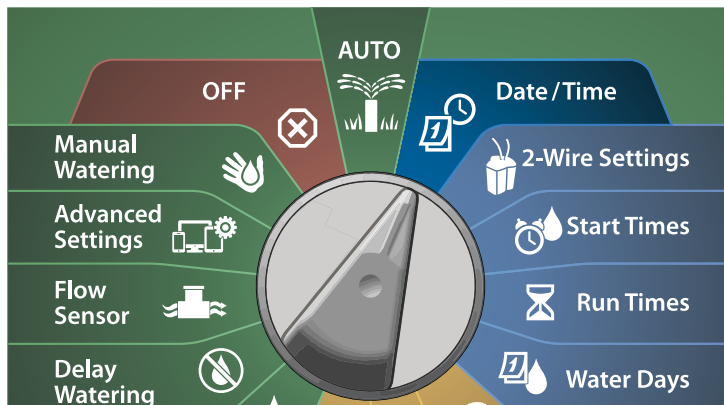

Master Valves

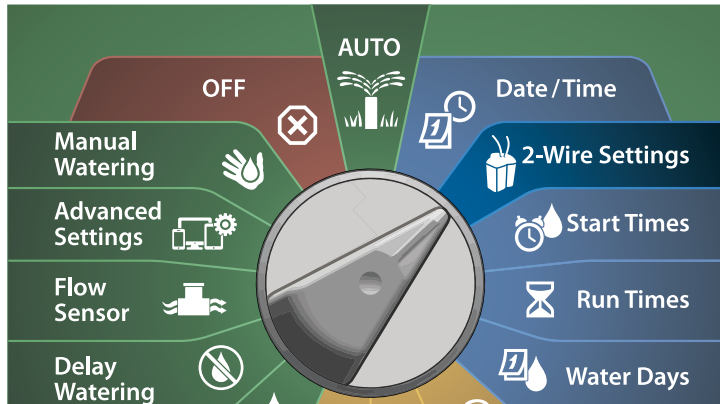
Master Valves Setup tells the ESP-LXIVM controller what types of master valves (MVs) are used by your irrigation system.

- The LX-IVM supports up to 5 Master Valves (or pump start relays) and the LX-IVM Pro supports up to 10.
- LX-IVM-Valves can be configured as either a Normally Open Master Valve (NOMV) or a Normally Closed Master Valve (NCMV).

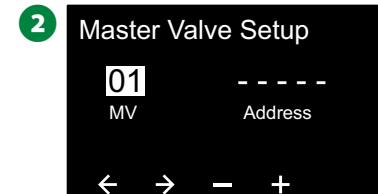
 NOTE: Pump start relays are set up in the controller as Master Valves. For more details, see the ESP-LXIVM Field Device Installation Guide that came with the controller.




Turn the dial to 2-Wire Settings



- 1 At the 2-WIRE SETUP screen, with Master Valves selected, press Next.
- 2 At the Master Valve Setup screen, press the + and – keys to set the desired Master Valve (from 1-10), then press the Right Arrow key.



- 3 Press the + and – keys to set the desired Master Valve Address. Press the Arrow keys to navigate between the number setting fields. Once all fields are entered, the Next key appears; press Next.


 NOTE: An alarm will show if a duplicate 2-Wire Device address is entered for more than one sensor. See "Alarms" on page 21 for more details.

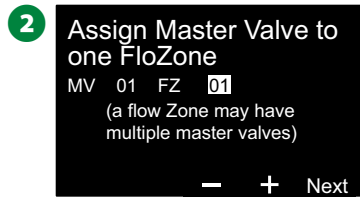
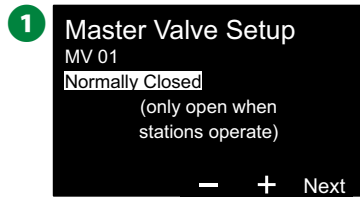


Normally Closed Master Valve

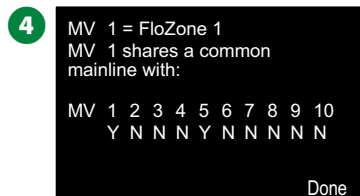
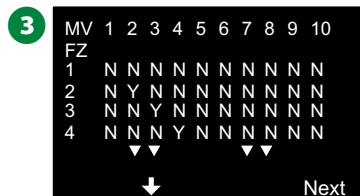
Normally Closed Master Valves open only when stations are operating.


- 1 At the Master Valve Setup screen, press the + and – keys to select Normally Closed, then press next.
- 2 At the FloZone assignment screen, press the + and – keys to associate the MV with the appropriate FloZone, then press Next.

 NOTE: A FloZone may have multiple master valves as it's source(s), but an MV can only be assigned to a single FloZone.



- 3 The Shared MVs screen shows the other MVs associated with the selected FloZone. Press the Arrow keys to select the desired FloZone, then press Next.
- 4 A review shows that settings for the MV. Press the Done key to complete the Master Valve setup. Or else press the Back button to go back and change settings if desired.



 Repeat this process to set up additional master valves. Be sure to note each MV in your Programming Guide for future reference.

Normally Open Master Valve

Normally Open Master Valves are open all the time and close only when a flow problem is detected.

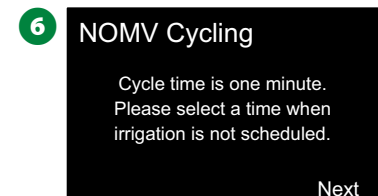
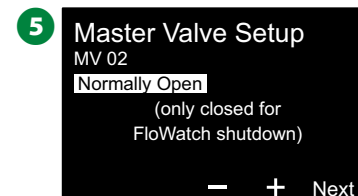
NOMV Cycling

In order to maintain the continuity of NOMV diaphragms and solenoids, the controller can be programmed to cycle them closed for a minute.

NOTICE

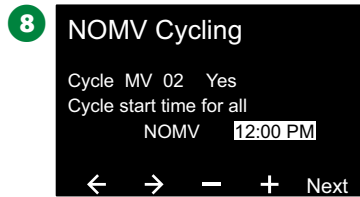
Each NOMV will be cycled closed for 60 seconds on the first day of each month. Irrigation is suspended when the NOMV is shut, so choose a time when no irrigation is scheduled.

- 5 At the Master Valve Setup screen, press the + and – keys to select Normally Open, then press Next.
- 6 At the NOMV Cycling confirmation screen, press Next to continue.



7 Press the + and – keys to select Yes for NOMV Cycling, then press the Right Arrow key.

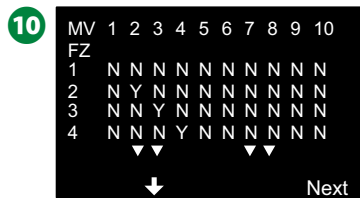
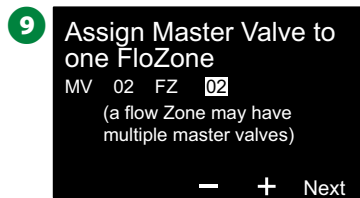
8 Press the + and – keys to set the Cycle Time, then press Next.



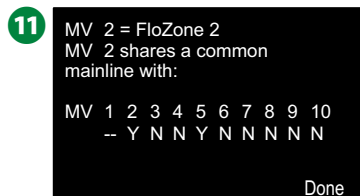
9 At the FloZone assignment screen, press the + and – keys to associate the MV with the appropriate FloZone, then press Next.

NOTE: A FloZone may have multiple MVs as it's source(s), but an MV can only be assigned to a single FloZone.

10 The Shared MVs screen shows the other MVs associated with the selected FloZone. Press the Arrow keys to scroll the list of FloZones, then press Next to continue.



11 A review screen shows the settings for the MV.



Repeat this process to set up additional master valves. Be sure to note each MV on your Programming Guide for future reference.

Weather Sensors

Weather Sensor Setup tells the ESP-LXIVM controller what types of weather sensors are used by your irrigation system.

Weather sensors are not required for the LX-IVM controller, but they increase functionality by allowing irrigation control based on changing weather conditions.

- The LX-IVM supports three 2-Wire Device weather sensors and the LX-IVM Pro supports seven.

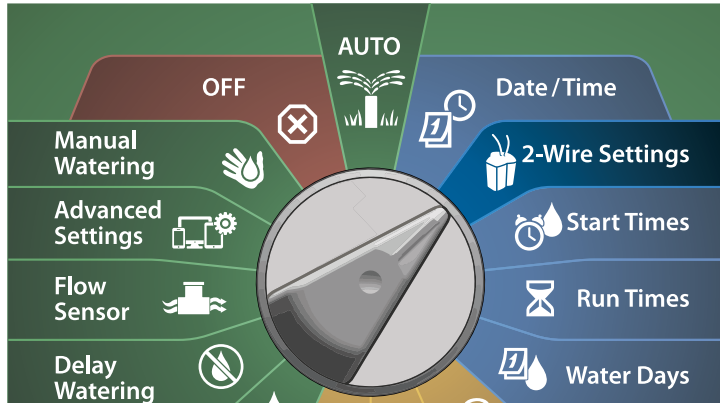

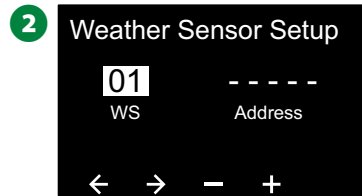
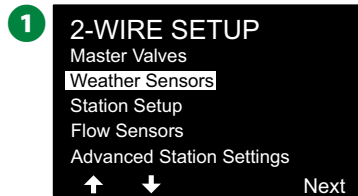

Turn the dial to 2-Wire Settings



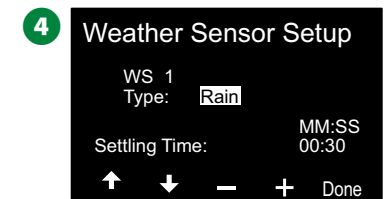
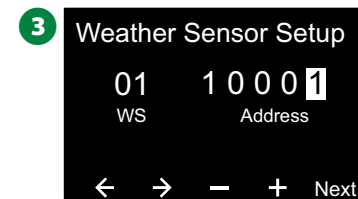
- 1 At the 2-WIRE SETUP screen, press the Down Arrow key to select Weather Sensors, then press Next.
- 2 At the Weather Sensor Setup screen, press the + and – keys to set the desired Weather Sensor (from 1-7), then press the Right Arrow key.



- 3 Press the + and – keys to set the desired Sensor Address. Press the Arrow keys to navigate between the number setting fields. Once all fields are entered, press the Next key.


 NOTE: An alarm will show if a duplicate 2-Wire Device address is entered for more than one sensor. See "Alarms" on page 21 for more details.


- 4 Press the + and – keys to select the type of weather sensor (Rain, Freeze, Wind, Soil Moisture, Custom Pause, or Custom Prevent), then press the Down Arrow key to continue.



- 5 Press the + and – keys to set the desired settling time.



 NOTE: Settling time is how long a weather condition must last before the controller takes action. For example, if a freeze sensor has a 5 minute settling time then the temperature would have to remain below the sensor's threshold set point for 5 minutes before irrigation is paused. Settling time can be set for immediate (0 seconds) or up to 10 minutes long.

 Repeat this process to set up additional weather sensors. Be sure to note each weather sensor on your Programming Guide for future reference.

Custom Pause Sensors

When a weather condition becomes true, a Custom Pause sensor will stop irrigation and also stop the irrigation timer. When the condition becomes false again, irrigation will start exactly where it left off.

For example, if a station is set to irrigate for 20 minutes but is shut down by a Pause sensor after only 5 minutes; when the weather condition becomes false again and after Resume, that station will receive the full remaining 15 minutes of irrigation left on the timer.

Custom Prevent Sensors

When a weather condition becomes true, a Custom Prevent sensor will stop irrigation but allow the irrigation timer to continue to run. Then when the condition becomes false again, irrigation will resume at the same time had the weather condition never occurred.

For example, if a station is set to irrigate for 20 minutes but is shut down by a Prevent sensor after only 5 minutes, if the condition becomes false again after 10 minutes then that station will only receive the remaining 5 minutes of irrigation left on the timer.

Local Weather Sensor

Both the LX-IVM and IVM Pro support one local weather sensor. See "Connect Local Weather Sensors" on page 48 for more details.

Set Priority


Each station can be set to high, medium, low or Non-irrigation.

The controller will run all high priority stations first, then all medium and finally all low priority, regardless of the station's program settings.

- 1 At the Station Setup screen, with Set Priority selected, press Next to continue.

 NOTE: Station Priorities are only used when Station Sequencing is set to Sequence by Station Priority. If you're using the default Sequence by Station Numbers, then skip the next step by pressing Next.

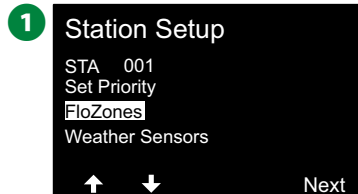

FloZones

Advanced Station Settings

Cycle+Soak™


The ESP-LXIVM controller Cycle+Soak feature allows water to be applied to stations intermittently.

This can apply to any station and is useful for locations such as hill-sides which can be difficult to irrigate effectively.

Cycle+Soak consists of two settings:

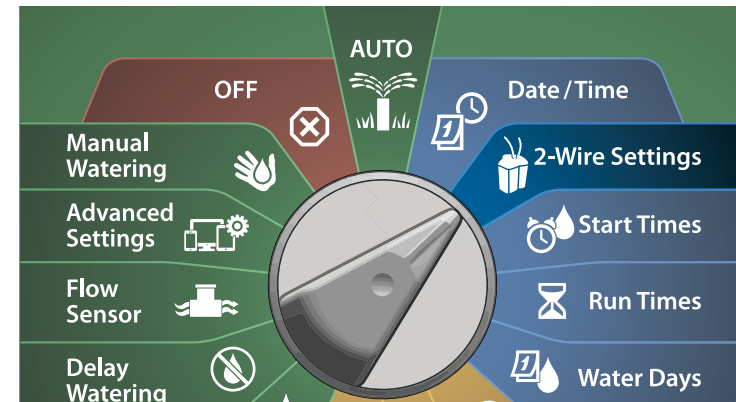
1. **Cycle time:** How long a station will run before soaking.
2. **Soak time:** How long irrigation is paused before applying another cycle.

For example, a station can be set up to receive 15 minutes of irrigation in three 5 minute cycles, with two 10 minutes periods of soak time in between waterings.

 NOTE: Cycle+Soak settings apply to stations no matter which programs it may be used in.

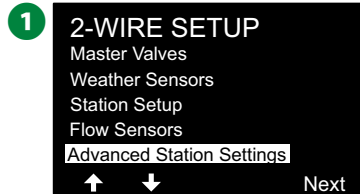

NOTE: Consider using short Inter-station Delay times, particularly if your watering schedule or Water Window is short. Long delay times could prevent scheduled irrigation from completing prior to the end of the Water Window.



Change the Program Select switch and repeat this process to set Inter-station Delay for other programs as desired.

SimulStations

The ESP-LXIVM controller can be set to operate multiple stations simultaneously.

You can set the maximum number of stations per program that are allowed to run. This can be beneficial for systems with a large water source and to help ensure watering is completed in the water window.

CAUTION

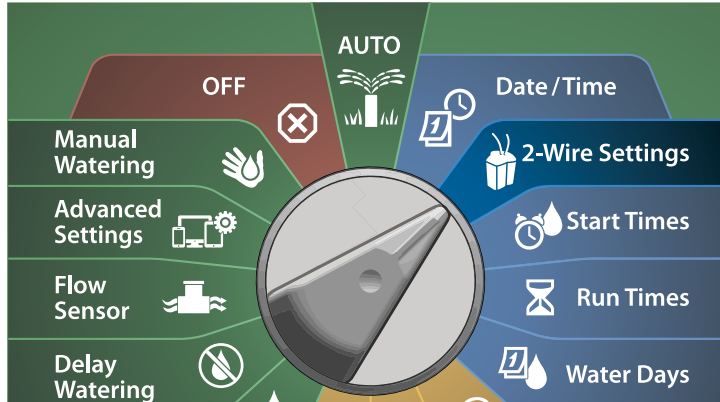
The LX-IVM can run 8 stations concurrently and the LX-IVM Pro can run 16 concurrent. Many irrigation systems do not have sufficient hydraulic capacity to accommodate such a load.

SimulStations can be used to control the maximum number of stations per program or for the entire controller. But a better alternative would be to enable Flo-Manager® and set program-level SimulStations to a fairly high number. This will allow Flo-Manager® to provide maximum irrigation based on your system's hydraulic capacity. See "Set Flo-Manager®" on page 83 for more details.

Select Water Days

Watering Days are the specific days of the week on which irrigation is allowed to occur.

The ESP-LXIVM controller supports a variety of flexible watering day cycle options.


- **By Day of Week:** irrigation starts at chosen individual days in the week where program starts are allowed, .
- **Cyclic days:** irrigation starts at regular chosen intervals such as every 3rd or 5th day, regardless of the calendar date.
- **Even Dates:** irrigation starts on all even numbered calendar days, such as the 2nd, 4th, 6th, etc.
- **Odd Dates:** irrigation starts on all odd numbered calendar days, such as the 1st, 3rd, 5th, etc.
- **Odd Dates no 31st:** irrigation starts on all odd numbered calendar days, such as the 1st, 3rd, 5th, etc., but not on the 31st.

 NOTE: Regardless of the Watering Cycle, irrigation will start only on days of the week where program starts are allowed.

Interpreting Ping Results

- If the device does not respond verify the address and check the wire splices.
- The voltage reading is a measurement of the charge of the device capacitors. If the voltage is low, wait a minute then ping again.
- If the voltage is still low (below 23 volts) check the wire splices. If the splices are good replace the device.

Test Shorted Paths

The ESP-LXIVM controller can quickly determine if faults are present on the 2-Wire path.

Although finding the exact location of issues in the field often requires some amount of in-the-field troubleshooting with a clamp meter, the controller has some built-in features to help you narrow down the possible issues.

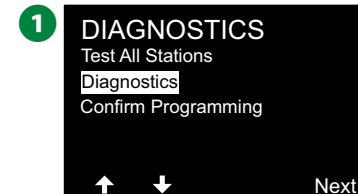
Before beginning 2-Wire diagnostics, it may be helpful to take the following steps to eliminate possible other causes:

- **Review Station Priorities:** The LX-IVM controller can be configured to irrigate based on the station priorities. If multiple programs are running, higher priority stations will irrigate prior to medium priority stations, and medium priority stations will irrigate prior to lower priority stations. See "Set Priority" on page 29 for more details.
- **Run Test All Stations:** The Test All Stations manual test will take priority above pre-programmed irrigation and allow you to determine which stations are working properly. See "Test All Stations" on page 101 for more details.

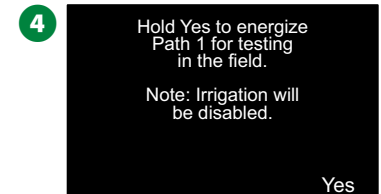
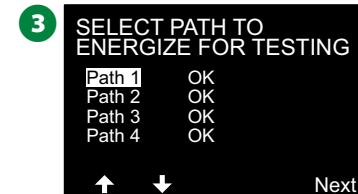

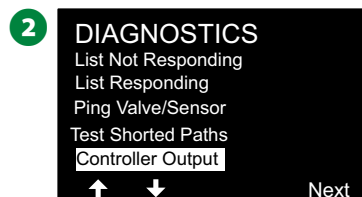
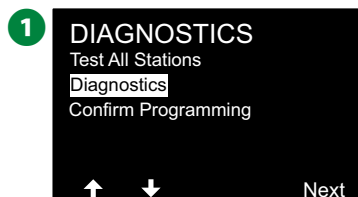
Controller Output

If one or more 2-Wire Devices are not working properly, you can run Controller Output diagnostic tests at the controller.

- 2 At the second DIAGNOSTICS screen, press the Down Arrow key to select Controller Output, then press Next.



- 3 The Controller Output results will be shown on a single screen.



-  NOTE: Current readings show all four 2-Wire paths combined and not a particular path.

Interpreting Controller Output Results

Controller Output checks line voltage and milliamp draw.

Use the range (1 mA to 400mA , Above 23V) to determine if the current are voltage values are outside the limits. If the Controller Output current or voltage values are outside the limits, follow these steps:

1. Remove all 2-Wire path wires from the IVM 2-Wire Interface Module and rerun the Controller Output test. Readings should now be within limits.
2. Reconnect one 2-Wire path wire to the IVM 2-Wire Interface Module at a time. Then rerun the Controller Output test. If the survey results are outside the limits then the 2-Wire path wire that is connected is the source of the problem.
3. Check the 2-Wire path, splices and 2-Wire Device splices for shorted wires or leaks to ground.
4. Press the 2-Wire Diagnostics/Ping 2-Wire Device feature to determine which 2-Wire Devices the LX-IVM controller can communicate with and which devices it cannot communicate with. The 2-Wire splices between the last 2-Wire Device that responds and the first device that does not respond is likely the location of the problem.

Confirm Programming

The ESP-LXIVM controller can make calculations and provide feedback on Start Times and total Run Times for programs and stations.

Seasonal Adjust

Seasonal Adjust allows you to use the heaviest irrigation season as a baseline so that lesser amounts of watering occur during those seasons.

For example, you could set July at 100% and set October to 50% so there would be half as much watering in Fall than in Summer. Seasonal adjustments can be managed by month or by program.

NOTICE

Multiple Seasonal Adjustment settings affect each other and can significantly impact irrigation. For example, if you set a program-level Seasonal Adjustment of 10% and then a monthly Seasonal Adjustment of 10% then irrigation will be reduced to 1% of normal (10% of 10%). Consider using only one type of Seasonal Adjustment setting.

Setting a small number for the Seasonal Adjustment percentage will greatly reduce watering and setting to 0% will cancel irrigation entirely. Use caution when making Seasonal Adjustment settings.

Individual Program

Watering is not allowed outside these "Water Windows". This is helpful to comply with local regulations which may prohibit irrigation during certain hours.

NOTICE

Be sure a Water Window is sufficient to allow irrigation programs to run completely. Irrigation scheduled outside the Water Window will be paused and will resume when the Water Window opens again. This can cause irrigation programs to "stack" and eventually create an alarm condition if the controller stacks 8 or more programs.

 NOTE: Water windows can be scheduled to cross midnight. For example, a Water Window can start at 10:00 PM and continue until 4:00 AM the next morning. Be sure your Watering Start Times are set to occur within the Water Window. See "Set Watering Start Times" on page 42 for more details.

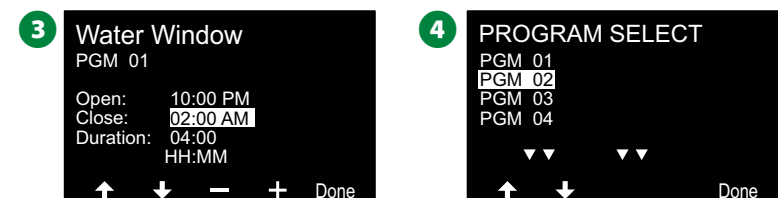

Introduction to Flow


The ESP-LXIVM controller offers a wide variety of flow-related functionality to utilize your system more efficiently, with or without additional flow sensing hardware.

FloZones Overview

A FloZone is a collection of one or more stations all using the same water source.

In a simple irrigation system such as a private residence, water is often supplied from a single source (typically from the local municipality) and in that case all stations are part of a single FloZone.

In a typical commercial installation, each FloZone will have its water source(s) controlled by individual Master Valve(s) (or MVs). For this reason, the number of FloZones is often the same as the number of MVs.

 NOTE: The number of FloZones can never be greater than the number of water sources and if multiple water sources (and likely MVs) supply the same section, then the number of FloZones will be less than the number of MVs.

- The LX-IVM supports up to 5 Master Valves, so as many as 5 FloZones can be created. The LX-IVM Pro supports up to 10 Master Valves, so as many as 10 FloZones can be created.

An irrigation system consisting of 5 MVs flowing into 5 individual main lines would result in 5 FloZones. An irrigation system consisting of 10 Master Valves flowing into one shared main line would result in 1 FloZone.

It's important to fully understand your system's hydraulic properties to set up your water sources, MVs and FloZones appropriately. For more information on setting up MVs and FloZones, see "Master Valves" on page 24 for more details.


Flow Management Features

After setting the Master Valves and FloZones for your system, the next step is to decide which flow-related features you'd like to use.

The LX-IVM controller flow features can be divided into two different functional groups; Flo-Manager® and FloWatch.


Flo-Manager®

Flo-Manager® adds basic hydraulic management features to your system to ensure that sufficient water pressure and volume is available to operate all stations.

 NOTE: Although it is helpful, flow sensing hardware is not required to use Flo-Manager®. You can manually enter estimated flow rates even if flow sensing hardware is not installed.

FloWatch™

FloWatch allows you to use any or all of the Flo-Manager® features but adds additional functionality such as alarms for high flow and low flow situations based on parameters you set and control. See "Set Flow Limits" on page 86 for more details.

 NOTE: Flow sensing hardware is required to use FloWatch.

Set Flow Rates


The LX-IVM controller lets you set the flow rates you expect or to automatically Learn Flow rates based on real usage.

If you do not have flow sensing hardware installed you may be able to estimate flow rates based on the irrigation hardware installed on a particular station or FloZone and manually enter this rate.


FloZone flow rates are either:

- Automatically set to the highest station flow rate assigned to the FloZone, or
- Manually adjusted by the user.

Learn Flow Automatically

 NOTE: To ensure accurate recording of flow rates, do not create any manually-generated flow such as flow created with manually operated quick coupling valves, while a Learn Flow is taking place.

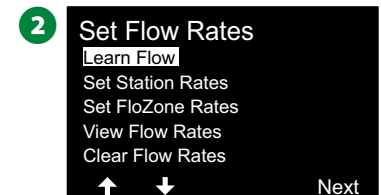
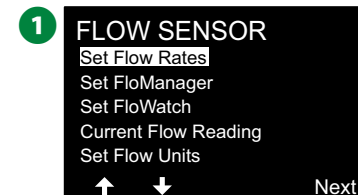

Flo-Manager® enables the controller to allocate available water capacity to various stations based on their hydraulic requirements. This can be done even if flow sensors are not present.

Flo-Manager® works by adding another layer of station or FloZone prioritization based on available water resources. For example, if FloZone 1 has 20 GPM available flow and two stations each consuming 6 GPM are currently in operation for a total of 12 GPM, Flo-Manager® Will not allow an additional station to start unless it consumes 8 GPM or less. This helps ensure that your system's hydraulic resources are not overtaxed and that sufficient water is available to every sprinkler in every station.

Flo-Manager® Set Up

 NOTE: If you have not already done so, use the 2-Wire Settings dial position to set up all master valves and their FloZones. See "Master Valves" on page 24 for more details.

It's not necessary to install or set up flow sensors to use Flo-Manager®, but if you do have this hardware present it's usually helpful to set it up prior to activating Flo-Manager®. See "Flow Sensors" on page 31 for more details.

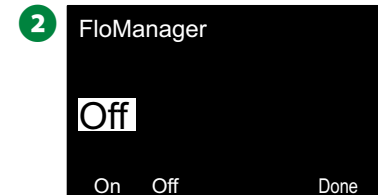
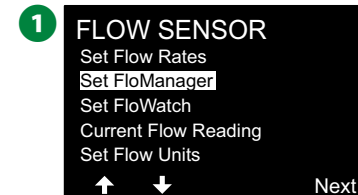
Once Flo-Manager® has been activated we recommend that you Learn Flow or manually enter flow rates for all stations and FloZones. This will allow Flo-Manager® to dynamically allocate water resources. If you do not have flow sensing hardware installed you may be able to estimate flow rates based on the irrigation hardware installed on a particular station or FloZone and manually enter this rate.

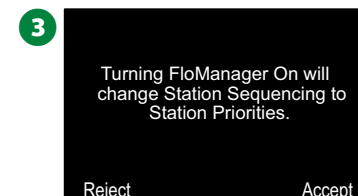

Set FloWatch™

FloWatch unleashes the true power of the ESP-LXIVM controller.

FloWatch compares current flow conditions to expected, learned or user-entered flow rates and takes various actions based on your settings and input. Since current flow conditions are required, FloWatch can only be used when flow sensors are present. To use FloWatch, you must do all of the following:

1. Install flow monitoring hardware into the appropriate locations of your irrigation system. You should install one flow sensor just downstream of each master valve but upstream of any station valves. To ensure stable readings, flow sensors should be installed at least ten times the distance of the pipe diameter downstream of the Master Valve with an additional five pipe diameter distance between the flow sensor and any additional hardware.
2. Connect each flow meter to an LX-IVM-Sensor Device. For more details, see the ESP-LXIVM Field Device Installation Guide that came with the controller.
3. Set up the flow sensors using the flow sensor setup. See "Flow Sensors" on page 31 for more details.
4. Follow the directions below to set up FloWatch.


 NOTE: Once you have set up FloWatch on the controller, the current flow rate will be shown on the Auto screen unless you turn off FloWatch. For more information on turning FloWatch on and off, see "Setting Up and Using flow" below.

FloWatch™ Set Up

The ESP-LXIVM controller lets you set the flow rates you expect or to automatically Learn Flow rates based on real usage.

Once flow is learned or manually entered, the High Flow and Low Flow settings let you define the parameters for excessive or low flow and to set the behavior of the controller when these conditions are detected. You can also turn FloWatch off or back on again if you like.

FloWatch needs expected flow rates to work properly. Flow rates can be entered manually or can be learned automatically through a Learn Flow process. An automatic Learn Flow operation will Learn Flow for each station that has programmed Run Times. Ensure you have set up runtimes for all stations included in a Learn Flow exercise prior to setting up a Learn Flow.

 NOTE: Prior to learning or manually setting station flow rates, it is a good idea to check the Master Valve assignments for each of your stations. See "Station Setup" on page 28 for more details.

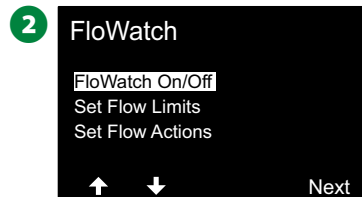
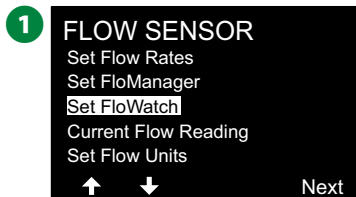
Water pressure, particularly from municipal sources, can vary significantly throughout the day. To mitigate this variance, press the time delay option to delay the Learn Flow start time to when irrigation would normally operate.

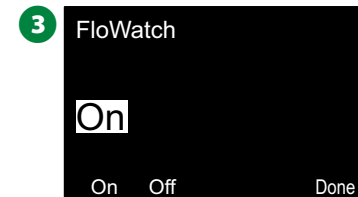

Set Flow Limits

SEEF (High Flow) and SELF (Low Flow) Settings and Actions

To most effectively use FloWatch™, you will want to first set your High Flow and Low Flow thresholds and actions. SEEF (High Flow) stands for Seek and Eliminate Excessive Flow and deals with how you want the controller to respond when excessive flow is occurring, as might be the case with a mainline break or a valve which is stuck in the open position. SELF (Low Flow) stands for Seek and Eliminate Low Flow and deals with what the controller should do when low flow is present, as might be the case during a pump failure, municipal water supply issue or when a valve fails to open.

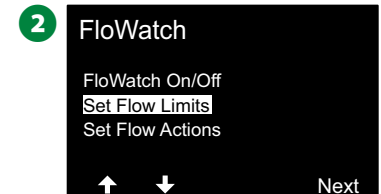

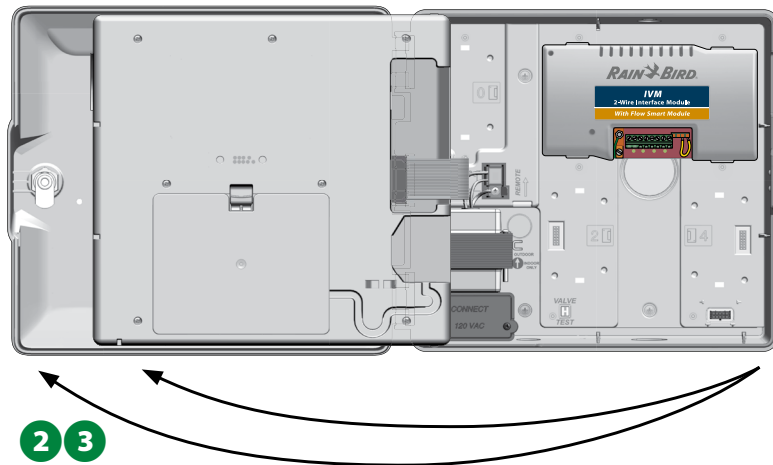
Access Controller Cabinet

Open or Remove Controller Front Panel

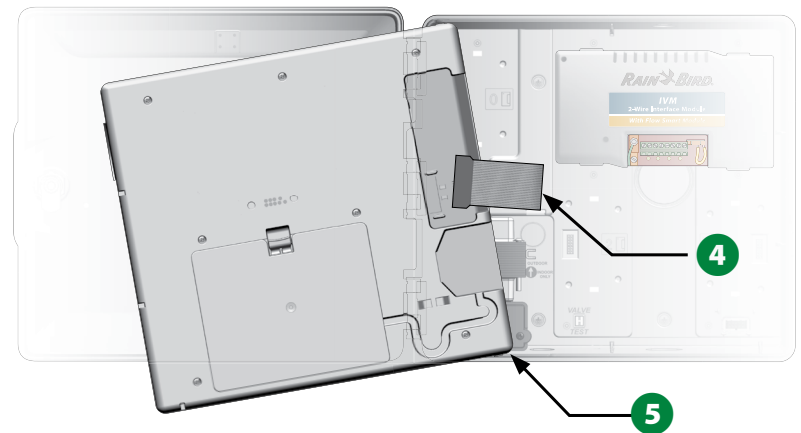

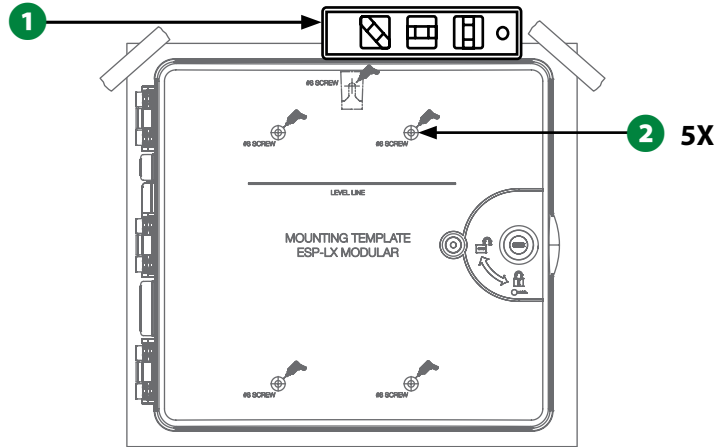

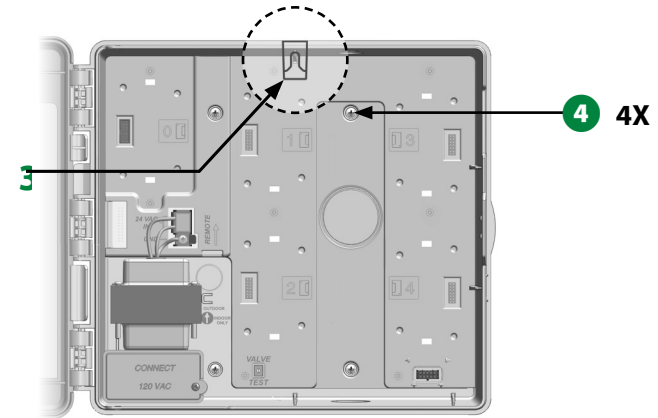
Mount Controller

- 1** Using a level, tape the mounting template to the mounting surface at approximately eye level. Make sure that at least one of the five mounting hole marks is aligned on a wall stud or other solid surface.
- 2** Use a tapping tool (or nail) and hammer to tap pilot holes through the five mounting hole marks and into the mounting surface. Then remove the template and drill holes in the mounting surface, installing wall anchors if necessary.

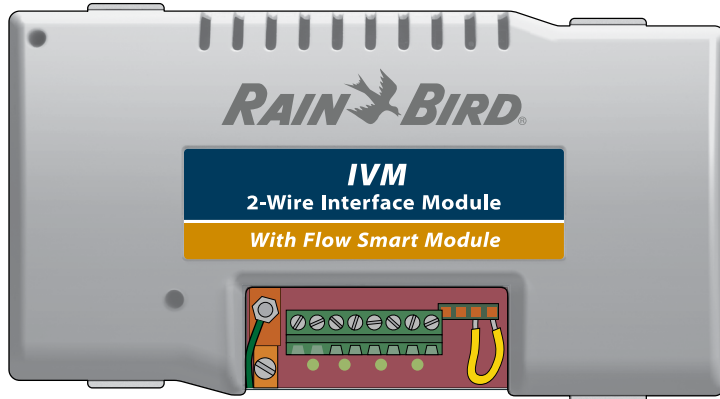


- 3** Drive the first screw into the topmost-center hole. Then hang the controller on the screw by the key-hole slot on the back of the cabinet.

Install IVM 2-Wire Interface Module

An IVM 2-Wire Interface Module is required for operation and is included with every LX-IVM controller. The IVM Module powers and provides an interface from the controller to the 2-Wire path.



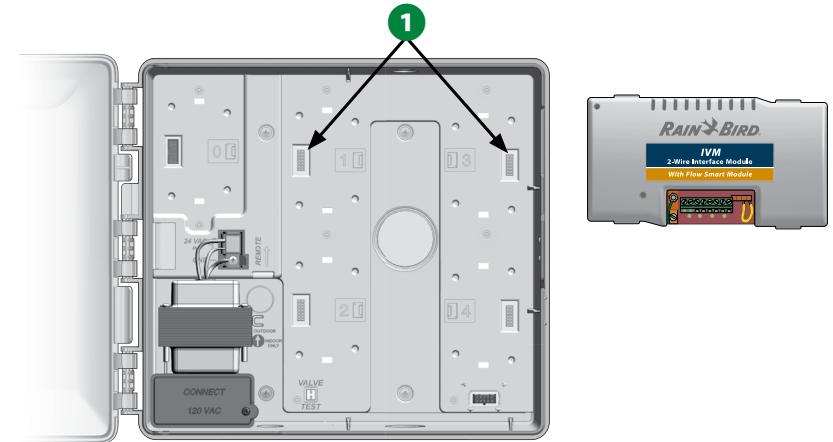

Do not install the communications cables in the same conduit as the 2-Wire path wiring.

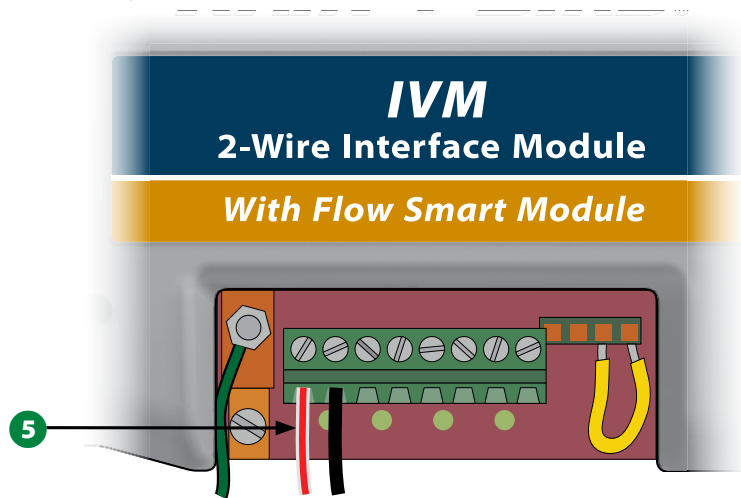
- 1 Strip away approximately 6 in (15,24 cm) of the cable's outer sheathing, then strip approximately 5/8 in (1,58 cm) of the insulation away from the ends of the two inner wires. See Wire Splices and 2-Wire Device Connections for more details on the correct way to splice wire connections.
- 2 If additional wiring access is needed, knock out one or more of the knockouts on the bottom of the controller cabinet. Using a screwdriver or other pointed tool, center the point of the tool on a "dimple" in one of the knockouts, then punch through and remove the knockout.



- 3 Screw a conduit fitting into the bottom of the cabinet, then attach conduit to the fitting.
- 4 Feed the 2-Wire communications cable through the conduit and into the controller cabinet.




- Using a thin blade screwdriver, connect the two wire ends to a set of large 2-Wire path terminals on the ESP IVM 2-Wire Interface Module. When finished, tug gently on the wires to make sure the connections are tight.



NOTICE

Wiring polarity must be correct in order for 2-Wire device to function properly. Connect the red wire to the terminal marked "RED1" and connect the black wire to the terminal marked "BLK1".

-  If you have multiple 2-Wire Paths then repeat this process to connect those wire ends to the other IVM 2-Wire Interface Module terminals as desired.

Surge Protection and Grounding

The ESP-LXIVM controller, IVM 2-Wire Interface Module and the 2-Wire path must be properly surge protected and grounded. Doing so can help prevent damage to the controller and irrigation system and also significantly reduce troubleshooting, repair time and expense. Failure to do so could result in failure of the controller and voiding the warranty.

CAUTION

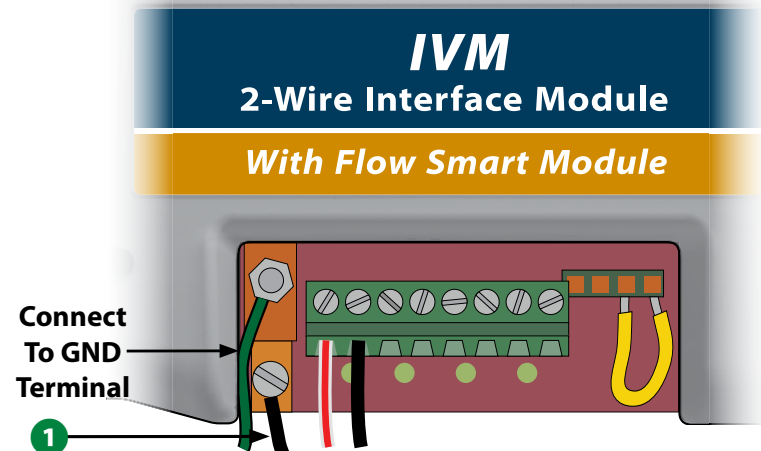
The LX-IVM controller and the IVM 2-Wire Interface Module must be properly grounded. Doing so can help prevent damage to the controller and irrigation system and also significantly reduce troubleshooting, repair time and expense. Failure to do so could result in failure of the controller and voiding the warranty. Ensure that all grounding devices are compliant with local electrical codes.

ESP-LXIVM Controller


The ESP-LXIVM Decoder Controller is protected against electrical surges through the ground provided by the primary ground of the incoming power to the controller.

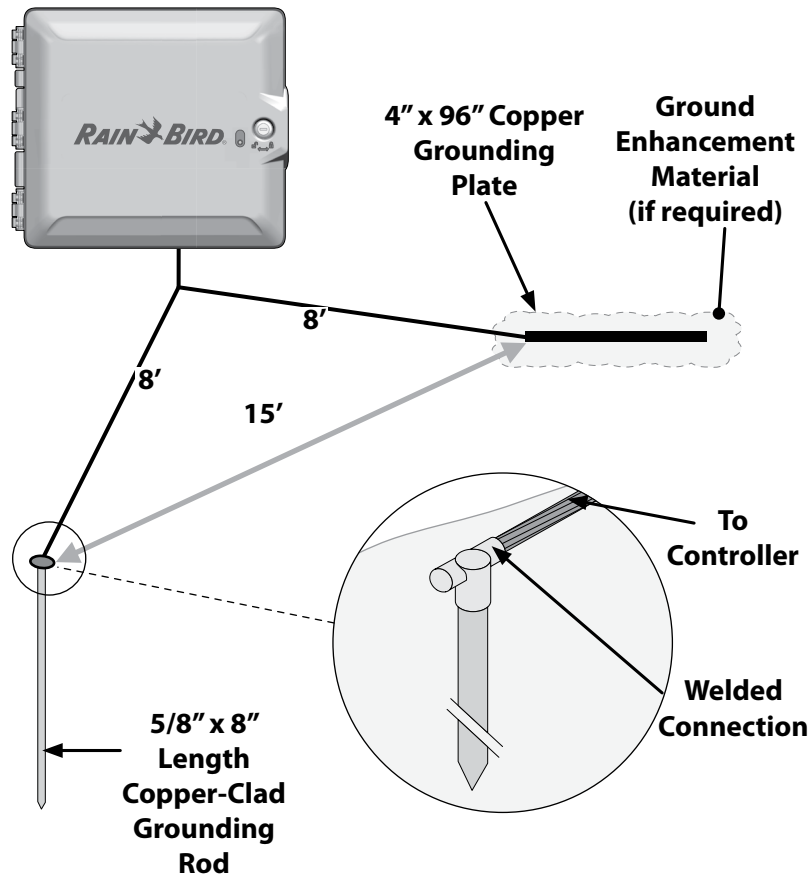
IVM 2-Wire Interface Module

- Connect #8AWG (10mm) or #10AWG (6MM) bare copper wire to the IVM Module ground lug.

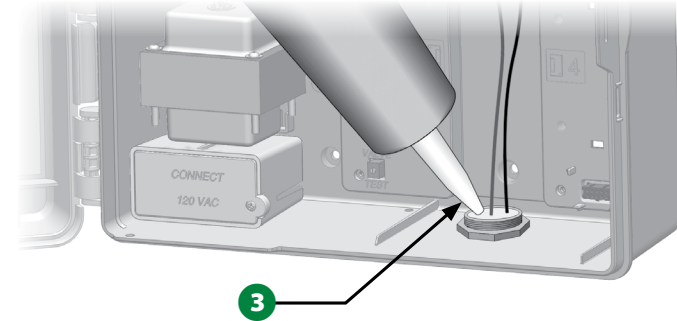


- 2 Connect the other end of the ground wire to a grounding rod(s) and/or plate with a resistance to ground of 10 ohms or less.

- 3 Once wiring is completed, fill top of conduit with waterproof caulking to prevent insect intrusion into the controller cabinet.



- 4 IVM-SD provides surge protection for the ESP-LXIVM Controller and the IVM 2-Wire interface module against electrical surges originating from each 2-Wire Path utilized. IVM-SD shall be spliced into each 2-Wire Path immediately where the IVM-SD can be taken to ground to the ESP-LXIVM Controller.

2-Wire Path

- 1 The 2-Wire path shall be surge protected and grounded with one IVM-SD every 500 feet or every 15 field devices, whichever is smaller.
- 2 Termination of 2-Wire Path – An IVM-SD shall be installed at the end of the 2-Wire path in a STAR configuration.

Connect Power to the Controller

Connect Power Source

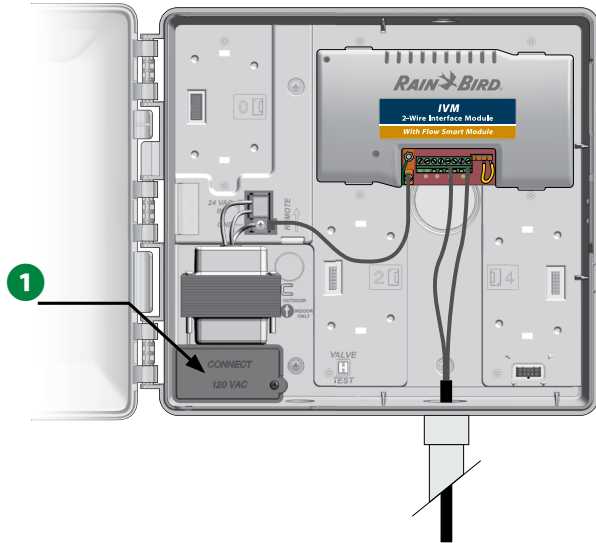
The ESP-LXIVM controller has an internal transformer that reduces supply voltage (120 VAC in U.S. models; 230 VAC in International and European models; 240 VAC in Australian models) to 24 VAC to operate the 2-Wire Devices connected to the controller. You will need to connect power supply wires to the transformer's three wires.

⚠ CAUTION


Electric shock can cause severe injury or death. Make sure power supply is turned OFF before connecting power wires.

All electrical connections and wiring runs must be made according to local building codes.

- 1 With the front panel removed, locate the transformer wiring compartment in the lower left corner of the controller cabinet. Remove the screw on the right-hand side and pull the cover off to expose the wiring compartment.

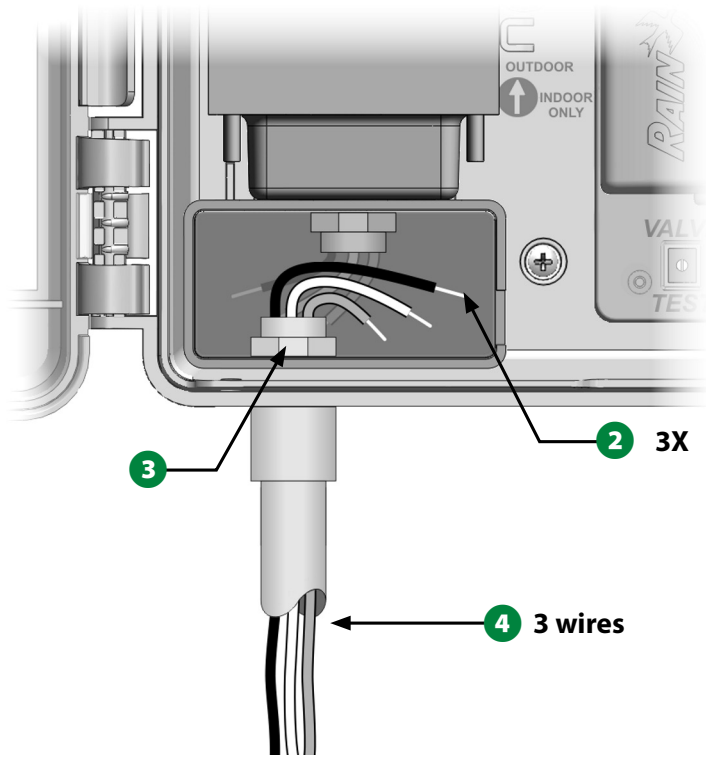
 NOTE: 240 VAC Australian models come equipped with an installed power supply cable.

- 2 Strip the insulation from the three incoming wires to expose approximately 1/2 in (13 mm) of bare wire.
- 3 Remove the knockout on the bottom of the cabinet below the transformer and attach a 1/2 in (13 mm) conduit fitting to the bottom entrance of the wiring compartment.

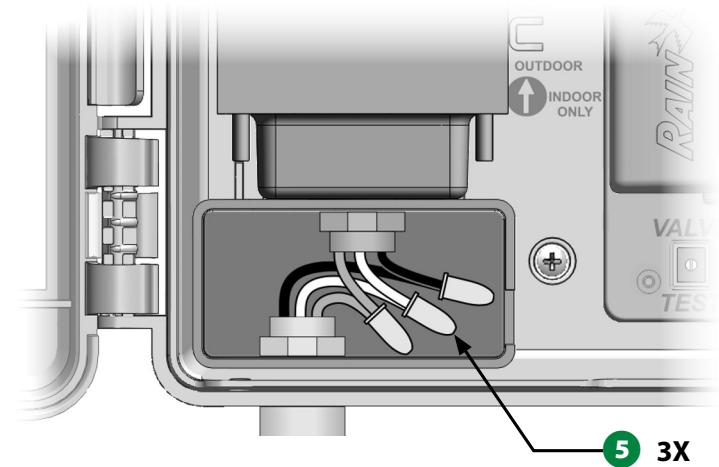
NOTICE

240 VAC (Australian) units do not require a conduit because the power supply cable is already installed.

- 4 Feed the three supply wires from the power source through the conduit into the wiring compartment.



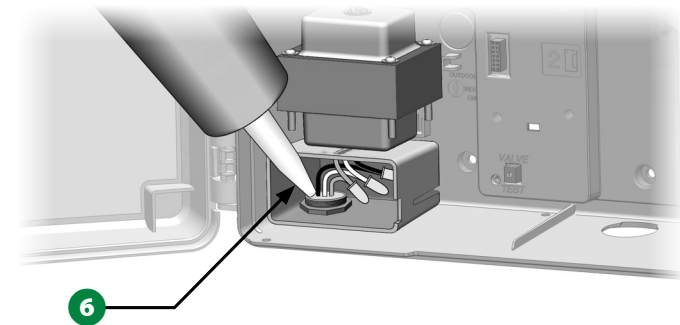
- 5 Using supplied wire nuts, connect the wires accordingly.



CAUTION

The ground wire **MUST** be connected to provide electrical surge protection. You will void the controller warranty if you do not ground the controller.

- 6 Once wiring is completed, fill top of conduit with waterproof caulking to prevent insect intrusion into the controller cabinet.



- 7 Verify that all connections are secure. Then replace the cover of the transformer wiring compartment and secure it with the screw.

Complete Installation

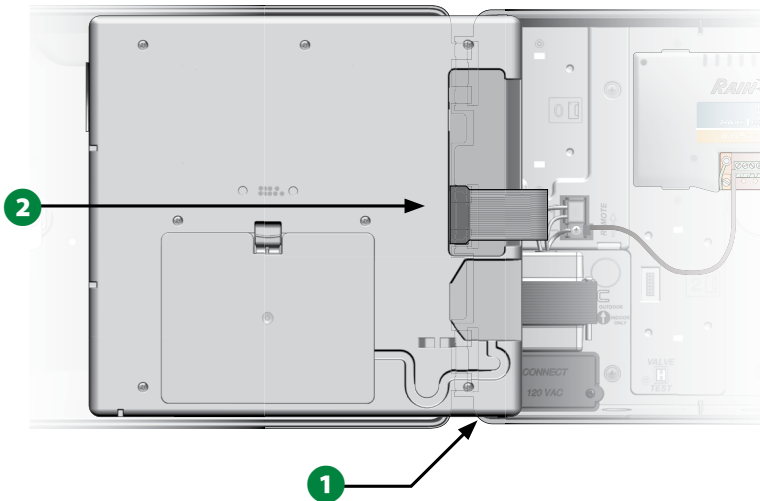
⚠ CAUTION

To prevent electrical shock, make sure all supply power is OFF before completing installation. Electrical shock can cause severe injury or death.


- 1 If you removed the front panel, reinstall it now by inserting the top corner pin into the top pin-hole, then push up and rock the bottom corner pin into the lower pin-hole.
- 2 Reconnect the ribbon cable to the front panel by gently pushing the connector into the socket.

NOTICE

Be careful NOT to bend the pins in the socket.




- 3 Turn on the power source.

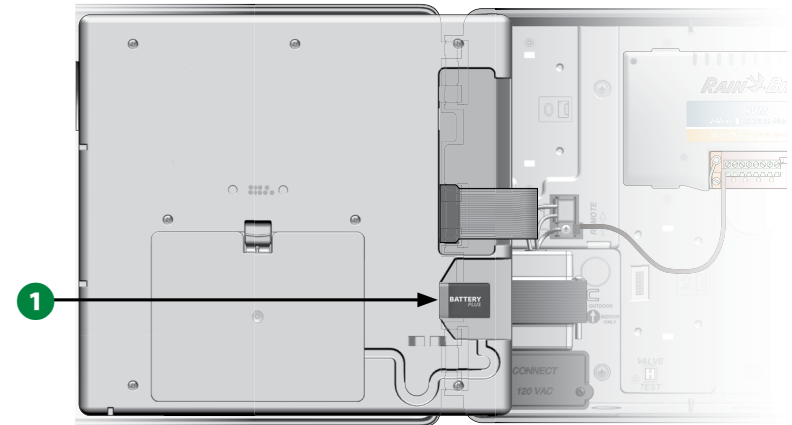
 NOTE: The first time you power up the controller, the display will prompt you to select the language you wish to use. See "Language Select Button" on page 19 for more details.


Programming Under Battery Power

The ESP-LXIVM controller front panel can operate under battery power for remote programming. This feature is especially useful if the controller is installed in an area that is not easily accessible. It also lets you enter program information before installing the controller at the job site. All program information is stored in nonvolatile memory so it will be preserved indefinitely in the event of a power outage.

 NOTE: Under battery power, all programs in progress will continue to run in memory, but irrigation will not occur until power is restored. Without battery power, remaining programs will be cancelled.

- 1 Install a new 9-volt battery in the battery compartment in the back of the front panel.



 NOTE: To perform remote programming, detach the front panel from the cabinet. See Access Controller Cabinet for more details.

NOTICE

The controller can not run irrigation or system diagnostics with the front panel detached. Re-connect the front panel to the controller's AC power source as soon as remote programming is completed.

IQ™ Central Control System

Rain Bird LX controllers including the LX-IVM can be optionally upgraded to communicate with the IQ Central Control System, providing remote communication capability for programming and monitoring multiple Rain Bird LX controllers from a computer, tablet, or smart phone.

IQ™ Network Communication Cartridge

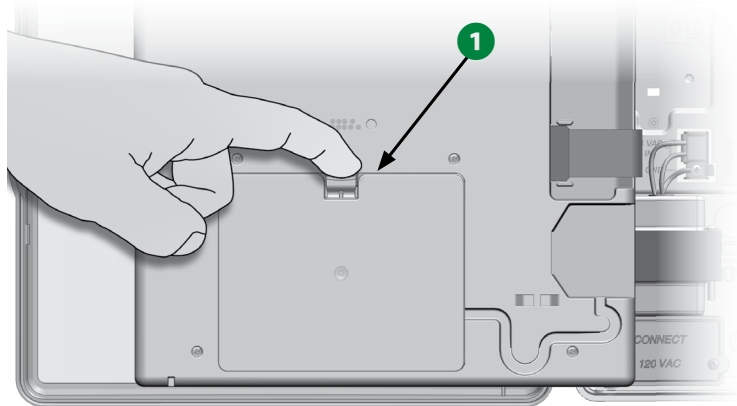

NCC Cartridge Installation (Optional)

- 1 Open the controller outer door and inner front-panel. Locate the cartridge bay cover on the back of the front-panel and press down on the top-latch to remove it.



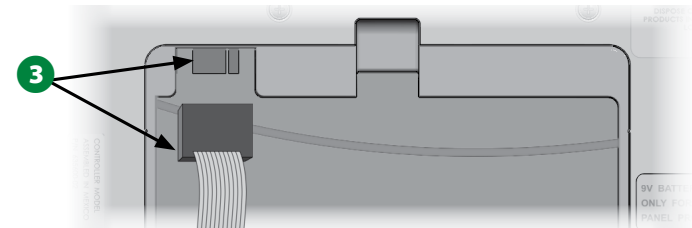
- 2 Connect the IQ Port cable or antenna to the cartridge. This cable or antenna provides communication to the IQ computer.

 **NOTE:** Follow instructions that came with your NCC Cartridge in order to connect to the IQ Central Control System.

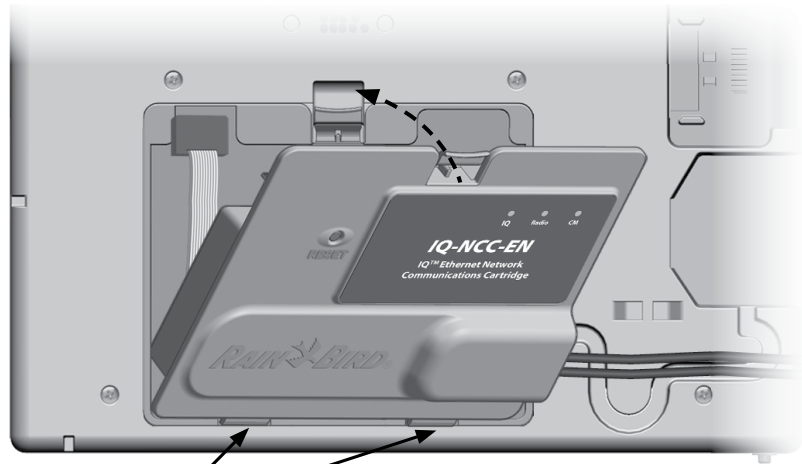
- 3 Connect the NCC cartridge ribbon cable to the knife-edge connector inside the top-left corner of the cartridge bay.

NOTICE

Ensure that the RED edge of the ribbon cable is towards the LEFT side of the connector.

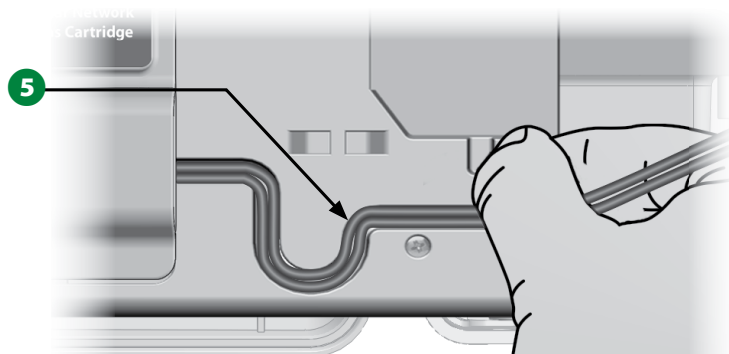


- 4 Orient the NCC cartridge so that the two bottom hinges fit into the hinge openings at the bottom of the cartridge bay. Then gently swing the cartridge up into place, snapping the top-latch.
